POST-16 ADVICE SHEET — WHAT IS OUT THERE?

You have to remain in education or training until you are 18. This does not mean you have to stay on at school after Year 11.

You can:

- Stay in full time education at any 6th form or college.
- Do full-time work-based learning such as an Apprenticeship.
- Do part-time training alongside working (including self-employment) or volunteering for over 20 hours a week.

In school, in your PD/PSHE lessons, you will put together a career portfolio including a CV and use Unifrog which will prepare you for the next step in your career. This will include visitors from local colleges and providers who will be able to give you lots of advice. You will all have the chance to meet with a careers adviser from Careers South West to talk through your options and some of you will have more than one appointment, this decision is yours, the more work you do the happier you will be with your choice. Remember you need to do all you can to achieve at least grade 4 in Maths and English else you will have to redo these wherever you go.

You need to begin your research NOW, all providers will have Open events and they will open at different times for applications.

INTRODUCTION TO OUR SIXTH FORM

The Sixth Form at Saltash Community School aims to match the needs, interests, plans, abilities and aspirations of all students.

TO DO THIS WE OFFER

- a caring but focused atmosphere within which students are encouraged to take responsibility for their own development, with the support of their teachers.
- individual guidance and support from before Year 11 through to A Level Results Day and beyond.
- opportunities for students to develop their skills and abilities, both in and outside of the classroom.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

The standard entry requirements are 5 GCSE grades 4-9 including English or Maths. Students who achieve a grade 4 at either English or Maths, but not both, will be allowed to enter the Sixth Form on condition of re-sitting the relevant subject.



IT IS EQUALLY IMPORTANT THAT YOU ARE ALSO

- genuinely committed to further study, with a good or better attitude to learning.
- likely to benefit from and succeed in the courses you have agreed to follow.
- willing to accept the responsibilities, as well as the privileges, of being a Sixth Form student at the school.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

The school has funds allocated by the government to support young people with the costs incurred during their post-16 education with particular financial needs. Students should collect full details and an application form from the Sixth Form Office which will be available during our Induction Days.

STUDY PROGRAMME

The vast majority of students will take three A Level or equivalent courses. They can choose to take four for the first two weeks to help them decide. Students are only permitted to continue four subjects by agreement and if they have appropriate GCSE grades.

With the range of subjects that we offer it is possible to enter any career or university course.

A LEVELS

All A Levels are based on a mixture of coursework (in some subjects) and exams at the end of Year 13. There are no external exams in Year 12 but there will be internal progression exams to measure progress towards the final A Level examinations.

OTHER LEVEL 3 COURSES

These courses are equivalent to an A Level but have a greater practical or coursework element. They are worth UCAS (university) points equivalent to A Levels, but students with particular university courses in mind are advised to check the entry requirements to see which of these courses they will accept.

BROAD CURRICULUM

In addition, the vast majority of students undertake an Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) and all students participate in a robust PSHE (personal, social, health and economic education) curriculum, as well as a week's compulsory Work Experience; students also receive careers guidance in small groups from Year 12. The school participates in the 'Learn2Live' young driver safety programme, and the 'You're Hired' employment skills competition.

OTHER OPPORTUNITIES

Students may also choose to undertake volunteering, the Sports Leadership Award, and a variety of other opportunities to contribute to the wider life of the school including the Sixth Form Council, Sixth Form Sport, Youth Speaks competition, Drama productions and more.

In the meantime, you need to work hard to find an employer that will take you on, eg a garage if you want an Apprenticeship in mechanics. You will also need to register with a training provider, which may be Cornwall College or City College – see their prospectuses. You should also register on the National Apprenticeships website, all interested students will have specific talks on apprenticeships and support with applying, it is principally the same as applying for a job, CV's are very important, remembering you will be studying alongside working:

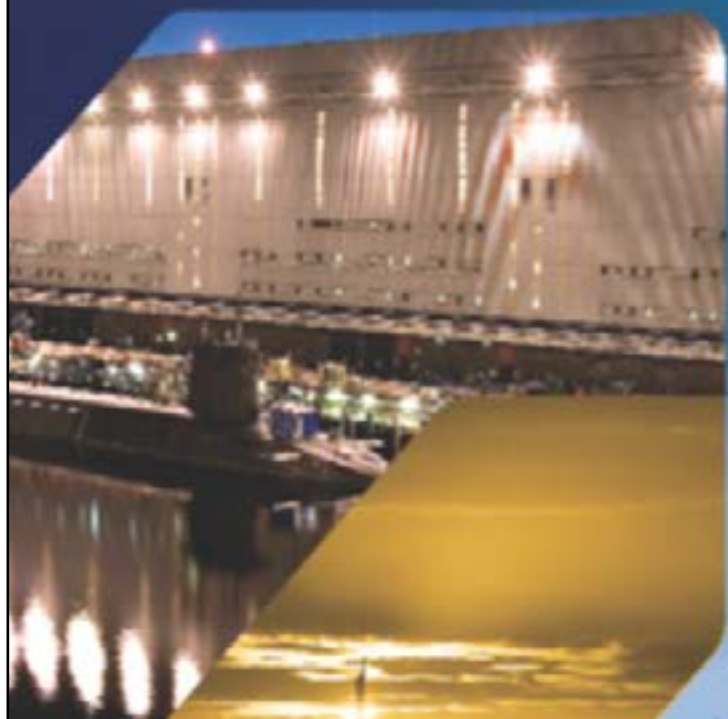
